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What is it?

- Financial Alignment Demonstration
 - CMS initiative to better serve “dual eligible” population
 - Two models- Capitated or Managed Fee for Service
 - Open to all states- 23 are pursuing
 - Three year projects

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Ohio's Demonstration

- Capitated payment model
- Seven regions
- 29 counties
- Five plans selected
- 114,000+ full dual eligibles
- Named "MyCare Ohio"

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Who will be enrolled?

- Those who are:
 - Eligible for Medicare (Parts A, B and D) and FULLY eligible for Medicaid;
 - Over the age of 18; and
 - Living in one of the demonstration counties.
- This includes:
 - Individuals in nursing facilities, in some home care programs (PASSPORT, Choices, Ohio Home Care, Transitions Carve Out, Assisted Living Waiver) and who are receiving behavioral health services in community settings



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- ### MyCare Ohio Benefits
- Benefit package includes all benefits available through the traditional Medicare & Medicaid programs
 - Long term services and supports
 - Nursing facility
 - Assisted Living Waiver
 - Home and community-based service waiver
 - PASSPORT, Choices, Ohio Home Care, Transitions Carve Out

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MyCare Ohio Benefits

- Behavioral health services
 - Community-based services
 - Severe Persistent Mental Illness Health Home
- Plans must cover prescription drugs
- Plans may include supplemental “value-added” benefits

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What are the advantages?

- One point of contact for care
- Care Management Support 24/7
- A team of professionals
- One ID card
- Focus on prevention and wellness
- Nurse Advice Line
- Better coordination= Better health outcomes

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Enrollee Protections

- Choice of at least two MyCare Ohio Plans in all Regions (three in Northeast)
- Ability to receive Medicare benefits as they do today

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Enrollee Protections

- Choice of at least two MyCare Ohio Plans in all Regions (three in Northeast)
- Ability to receive Medicare benefits as they do today
- MyCare Ohio Plan Member Advisory Groups
- A unified grievance & appeal process
- Strong quality management oversight
- Transition Requirements

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Transition Requirements

- Members may keep current providers
- Schedule/ duration may vary depending on:
 - Service
 - Population
 - Outcome of initial assessment
- Exceptions:
 - Consumer request or significant change
 - Provider discontinues services
 - Provider performance issues arise

 - Medina
- Plans in this region:
 - Buckeye, CareSource, United Health Care
- 32,805 eligible




 - Aetna
 - Buckeye
- 10,112 eligible

- Counties:
 - Butler
 - Clermont
 - Clinton
 - Hamilton
 - Warren
- Plans in this region:
 - Aetna
 - Molina
- 20,200 eligible

- Plans in this region:
 - Buckeye
 - Molina
- 13,008 eligible

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Letters from Medicaid

- Introductory Letter – December 2013
- Enrollment letter
 - What plans are in the area
 - Who to contact for more information
 - Make a choice between dual benefits enrollment (Medicaid and Medicare) or Medicaid-only enrollment

How to choose a plan

- Does your doctor work with the plan?
- Are any specialists you see included on the plan?
- Are the hospitals you prefer contracted with the plan?
- Are your prescription drugs covered by the plan?
- Are there additional benefits the plan offers that would be useful to you?



What about other services?

- Nursing Facility
 - No change to where you receive Medicaid services
- Assisted Living Waiver
 - No change to where you receive services
- PASSPORT or Choices Waiver
 - Continue with services in place
 - Continue with Area Agency on Aging as waiver service coordinator
- Ohio Home Care or Transitions Waiver
 - Continue with services in place
 - Access to waiver service coordinator

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What help is available to pick a plan?

- Enrollment letter- lists the plans available and information about how MyCare Ohio works

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Important Facts to Remember

- Must meet eligibility criteria
- At least two plans per region
- Both Medicare and Medicaid benefits
- Team of professionals working with you
- Help making a decision is available
